

TO THE DEALER:

Assembly and proper installation of this product is the responsibility of the Frontier dealer. Read manual instructions and safety rules. Make sure all items on the Dealer's Pre-Delivery and Delivery Check Lists in the Operator's Manual are completed before releasing equipment to the owner.

TO THE OWNER:

Read this manual before operating your Frontier equipment. The information presented will prepare you to do a better and safer job. Keep this manual handy for ready reference. Require all operators to read this manual carefully and become acquainted with all the adjustment and operating procedures before attempting to operate. Replacement manuals can be obtained from your selling dealer.

The equipment you have purchased has been carefully engineered and manufactured to provide dependable and satisfactory use. Like all mechanical products, it will require cleaning and upkeep. Lubricate the unit as specified. Observe all safety information in this manual and safety decals on the equipment.

For service, your authorized Frontier dealer has trained mechanics, genuine Frontier service parts, and the necessary tools and equipment to handle all your needs.

Use only genuine Frontier service parts. Substitute parts will void the warranty and may not meet standards required for safe and satisfactory operation. Record the model number and serial number of your equipment in the spaces provided:

This Operator's Manual should be regarded as part of the machine. Suppliers of both new and second-hand machines must make sure that the manual is provided with the machine.

GENERAL INFORMATION

READ THIS MANUAL carefully to learn how to operate and service your machine correctly. Failure to do so could result in personal injury or equipment damage. This manual and safety signs on your machine may also be available in other languages. (See your Frontier dealer to order.)

The illustrations and data used in this manual were current at the time of printing but, due to possible in-line production changes, your machine may vary slightly in detail. We reserve the right to redesign and change the machines as may be necessary without notification.

THIS MANUAL SHOULD BE CONSIDERED a permanent part of your machine and should remain with the machine when you sell it.

MEASUREMENTS in this manual are given in both metric and customary U.S. unit equivalents. Use only correct replacement parts and fasteners. Metric and inch fasteners may require a specific metric or inch wrench.

RIGHT-HAND AND LEFT-HAND sides are determined by facing in the direction of forward travel.

WARRANTY is provided as part of Frontier's support program for customers who operate and maintain their equipment as described in this manual. The warranty is explained on the warranty certificate or statement which you should have received from your dealer.

This warranty provides you the assurance that Frontier will back its products where defects appear within the warranty period. In some circumstances, Frontier also provides field improvements, often without charge to the customer, even if the product is out of warranty. Should the equipment be abused, or modified to change its performance beyond the original factory specifications, the warranty will become void and field improvements may be denied.

Setting fuel delivery above specifications or otherwise overpowering machines will result in such action.

If you are not the original owner of this machine, it is in your interest to contact your local Frontier dealer to inform them of this unit's serial number. This will help Frontier notify you of any issues or product improvements.

SAFETY

Read Safety in Machine Operator's Manual Read the general safety operating precautions in your machine operator's manual for additional safety information.

Operate Safely

- Read the machine and attachment operator's manual carefully. Be thoroughly familiar with the controls and the proper use of the equipment. Know how to stop the machine and disengage the controls quickly.
- Do not let children or an untrained person operate machine.
- Make any necessary adjustments before you operate. Never attempt to make any adjustments while the engine is running, unless if recommended in adjustment procedure.
- Take all possible precautions when leaving the machine unattended. Shut off the engine before making any repairs, adjustments, or inspections. Lower the attachment, lock the parking brake, stop the engine, and remove the key.
- Look behind machine before you back up. Back up carefully.
- Do not let anyone, especially children, ride on machine or attachment. Riders are subject to injury such as being struck by foreign objects and being thrown off. Riders may also obstruct the operator's view, resulting in the machine being operated in an unsafe manner.
- Use only attachments and accessories approved by the manufacturer of this product.
- If the machine vibrates abnormally, stop the engine and check immediately for the cause. Vibration is generally a warning of trouble.
- Always refer to the Storage section of the operator's manual for important details if storing this product for a long period of time.

- Keep people and pets out of the work area.
 Stop machine if anyone enters the area.
- If you hit an object, stop the machine and inspect it. Make repairs before you operate. Keep machine properly maintained and in good working order. Keep all shields and guards in place.
- Always inspect the sprayer completely before and after each use. Before pressurizing the system, check to be sure all fittings and hoses are tightly installed.
 Be sure guards and shields are in good condition and fastened in place. Make any necessary adjustments before you operate.
- Never use the sprayer during windy conditions.
- Always release pressure in the system before filling, cleaning or servicing the sprayer.
- Do not put nozzle tip or other sprayer parts to your lips to blow out dirt. Use compressed air.
- Install the recommended light kit when this equipment obscures the tractor's tail lamps or stop lamps when transported on the road. Contact your Frontier dealer to obtain the recommended light kit.

Parking Safely

- Stop vehicle on a level surface, not on a slope.
- 2. Lock park brake.
- 3. Lower 3pt attachment to the ground.
- 4. Stop engine.
- 5. Remove key.
- 6. Before you leave the operator's seat, wait for engine and all moving parts to stop.

Mix and Handle Chemicals Safely

 Wear full cover clothing and wear protective goggles and rubber gloves to protect yourself while handling chemicals

- Follow instructions on chemical container labels.
- Open all chemical containers carefully, using proper tools.
- Open, pour, weigh and mix chemicals in a well-ventilated area.
- Reserve all equipment used for the application of chemicals exclusively for that purpose.
- Prohibit all smoking, drinking and eating food in chemical-handling area.
- It is a good practice to take a soapy shower immediately after the using the sprayer to apply chemicals.
- Wash all clothing worn when using chemicals separately in the laundry after spraying is completed.

Read Chemical Container Label

- Chemicals can be dangerous. Improper selection or use can injure persons, animals, plants, soils or other property. Select the right chemical for the job and handle and apply with care.
- Read the instructions, precautions, and warnings on the container label before opening. Use the product strictly according to label directions for specific applications, in the amounts specified, at the times specified and only when needed.
- Keep the container closed tightly except when preparing the mix.
- Do not remove labels from chemical containers. Store all chemicals in their original containers.
- Do not mix chemicals unless stated on the container label.
- Store chemicals when not in use according to the container label.

Handle Chemical Products Safely

- Direct exposure to hazardous chemicals can cause serious injury. Potentially hazardous chemicals used with Frontier equipment include pesticides, herbicides and fungicides.
- A Safety Data Sheet (SDS) provides specific details on chemical products: physical and health hazards, safety procedures, and emergency response techniques.
- The SDS should be obtained from the chemical dealer at the time of the chemical purchase.
- Check the SDS before beginning any job using a hazardous chemical. Know exactly what the risks are and how to do the job safely.
- Always wear recommended personal protection equipment.

Practice Safe Maintenance

- Only qualified, trained adults should service this machine.
- Understand service procedure before doing work. Keep area clean and dry.
- Do not operate the engine in a confined space where dangerous carbon monoxide fumes can collect.
- Never lubricate, service or adjust the machine or attachment while it is moving.
 Keep safety devices in place and in working condition. Keep hardware tight.
- Keep hands, feet, clothing, jewelry, and long hair away from any moving parts, to prevent them from getting caught.
- Lower any attachment completely to the ground or to an existing attachment mechanical stop before servicing the attachment. Disengage all power and stop the engine. Lock park brake and remove the key. Let machine cool.
- Disconnect battery before making any repairs.

- Before servicing machine or attachment, carefully release pressure from any components with stored energy, such as hydraulic components and springs.
- Release hydraulic pressure by lowering attachment or cutting units to the ground or to a mechanical stop and move hydraulic control levers.
- Securely support any machine or attachment elements that must be raised for service work. Use jack stands or lock service latches to support components when needed.
- Never run engine unless park brake is locked.
- Keep all parts in good condition and properly installed. Fix damage immediately. Replace worn or broken parts. Replace all worn or damaged safety and instruction decals.
- Check all hardware at frequent intervals to be sure the equipment is in safe working condition.
- Do not modify machine or safety devices.
 Unauthorized modifications to the machine or attachment may impair its function and safety.


Transportation

- Use additional caution and reduce speed when under adverse surface conditions, turning, or on inclines.
- Do not operate or transport on steep slopes.
- Do not operate or transport equipment while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Always comply with all state and local lighting and marking requirements.
- Install the recommended light kit when this equipment obscures the tractor's tail lamps or stop lamps when transported on the road. Contact your Frontier dealer to obtain the recommended light kit.

Storage

Block equipment securely for storage.

 Keep children and bystanders away from storage area.



Wear Appropriate Clothing

- Wear close fitting clothing and safety equipment appropriate for the job.
- Certain operating conditions may dictate that the operator and any passenger wear appropriate safety equipment while operating the vehicle. Be prepared for any existing and potential conditions before operating machine.
- Local safety or insurance regulations may require additional safety equipment such as eye protection or a hard hat.
- Always wear substantial footwear and longlegged pants. Do not operate the equipment when barefoot or wearing open sandals.
- Wear proper clothing and safety equipment while handling chemicals or using the sprayer. Refer to the SDS for the chemicals being used to be sure the proper personal protection equipment is being used.

Dispose of Chemicals Properly

- Proper disposal of excess spray material is very important. If you have excess tank solution, it is best to dilute it with water and apply it to the area you previously treated.
- Never dump solution into a drain or near a lake or stream.
- Chemicals containers should be triplerinsed, with the rinse water added to the sprayer tank. Do not burn empty chemical containers. Dispose of containers at recycling centers.

Handling Waste Product and Chemicals

Waste products, such as, used oil, fuel, coolant, brake fluid, and batteries, can harm the environment and people:

- Do not use beverage containers for waste fluids someone may drink from them.
- See your local Recycling Center or authorized dealer to learn how to recycle or get rid of waste products.
- A Safety Data Sheet (SDS) provides specific details on chemical products: physical and health hazards, safety procedures, and emergency response techniques. The seller of the chemical products used with your machine is responsible for providing the SDS for that product.



ASSEMBLY

Dealer Set-Up Instructions

Assembly of this equipment is the responsibility of the Frontier dealer. It should be delivered to the owner completely assembled and adjusted for normal operating conditions.

In most cases the sprayer will be shipped completely assembled with the only assembly being the boom, the fresh water tank and 100 ft hose reel kit. The on-highway light kit can be added to the sprayer at a later time if desired.




Remove Sprayer from Shipping Pallet

- 1. Remove plastic stretch wrap from sprayer and boom.
- 2. Remove hardware that used to secure sprayer to pallet and remove sprayer from pallet.
- 3. If options are supplied, remove these from the pallet.
- 4. Remove nut (A) to detach PTO pump from sprayer and discard nut and bolt.




Install Fresh Water Tank

1. Install Spigot (A) onto Fresh Water Tank (B). Spigot is located inside of tank for shipping.




2. Place Fresh Water Tank on Bracket (C) and secure by routing Strap (D) over top of tank to J-Hook (E).




Control Valve Assembly

Control valve assembly is factory installed in a vertical position to protect it during shipping. This assembly should be re-positioned for optimal use and accessibility following these steps.

1. Carefully loosen bolts (A).




2. Rotate control valve to height required and place bottom bolt in appropriate hole (B) for desired position of valve. Tighten bolts.




Install Boom (18 ft and Boomless)

- 1. Center the boom on the rear of the main sprayer.
- 2. Locate the (2) main upright support brackets with holes.
- 3. Bolt the boom to the upright support brackets using two 5/16 inch square U-bolts (A) and four 5/16 inch flange nuts.




Install Boom (24 ft and 30 ft)

- 1. Center the boom on the rear of the main sprayer.
- 2. Locate the (2) main upright support brackets with holes.
- 3. Bolt the boom to the upright support brackets using two 5/16 inch square U-bolts (A) and four 5/16 inch flange nuts.
- 4. Fasten hinge brace to support brackets using two 5/16 inch 3/4 inch flange bolts (B) and two 5/16 inch flange nuts.



 Secure side boom hinge to center boom with hinge pin (A) and fasten with bowtie clip (B).


- 6. Remove bolt (D) and retain.
- 7. Connect spring (C) to bolts on the hinge backplate. Use of a spring puller will assist with assembly.
- 8. Reinstall bolt (D) and adjust so that the side boom is in line with center boom when extended.



Boom Hose Connections

NOTE: The hoses are the length needed for the 18 ft boom. For the 24 ft and 30 ft booms, cut 8 inches off the hoses for the side booms (A and C). For the boomless sprayers, pull the hoses out to the side fittings and cut as needed, leaving a little slack for adjustment of the control valve assembly.


- 1. Connect the hoses from the control valve to the appropriate sections of the boom.
- 2. Fasten with 1/2 inch hose clamps.




Boom Hoses

1. 18 ft boom: Use the wire ties (A) to fasten the hoses to the top of the square tubing of the side booms approximately 12 inches

away from both sides of the hinge pivot center point. Leave slack in the hose around the hinge area. Be sure the boom folds without pinching the hose.



 24 ft and 30 ft booms: Use wire ties (A) to fasten the hoses to the flat support piece connecting the side hinges of the side booms, leaving the slack in the hose around the hinge area. Be sure the boom folds without pinching the hose.




Boom Adjustment

NOTE: 24 ft and 30 ft booms only.


- Move the cross brace (A) to the appropriate upper position (B) so that when the boom is folded, the rubber bumper (C) stops against the cross brace (A). If the top bolt holding the boom is using the top hole among lower positions (D) the top cross brace will also use the top hole (B).
- 2. Put the S-Hook (E) through the eyebolt (F) and mark the farthest spot down on the rope where the S-Hook reaches.
- 3. Fold the boom.
- 4. Grab the rope with a hand about an inch or two on either side of the marked spot on the rope and push together to open the weave in the rope. Put the opposite end of the S-Hook through the rope.
- 5. Open boom.
- 6. Adjust the side boom until it is parallel with the ground either by folding the boom and

attaching the S-Hook out farther on the rope, or adjusting the eyebolt.




(Optional) Install 100 ft Hose Reel Kit

 Install Hose Reel (A) on top of Mounting Bracket (B) with the knob facing the front of the sprayer using four 5/16" x 1/4" Carriage Bolts (C) and four 5/16" Flange Nuts (D) as shown.




- 2. Torque all fasteners to recommended torque. (See Torque Table section)
- 3. Attach free end of 1/2" hose from Hose Reel to Tee Fitting (E) and secure with 1/2" Screw Type Hose Clamp (F).




(Optional) On-Highway Kit Installation


- Install Right Hand Light Bracket (A) to outside of uprights using two 5/16" x 3/4" Carriage Bolts (B) and two 5/16" Flange Nuts (C). Torque Flange Nuts to recommended torque. (See Torque Table section)
- 2. Repeat Step 1 for Left Hand Light Bracket.
- 3. Install Rear Light Assembly (D) on Left Hand and Right Hand Light Brackets ensuring that both the red and amber lights are facing the rear of the sprayer with the amber lights on top, using four 1/4" x 1-1/4" Hex Bolts (E) and four 1/4" Nylock Nuts (F) per light. Nylock nuts should NOT be overtightened as this could crack the plastic light housings.




4. Loosen Hose Guide Bracket (G) and route Light Kit harness starting with two 4 pin connectors alongside hoses.




5. Continue to route harness under the right side of the sprayer on the inside of the frame and above the brace that holds the drain filter/valve assembly (H).




6. Route harness section labeled "LEFT" along rear top frame section of sprayer.



- 7. Connect harness end connectors to right and left lights.
- 8. Install push in cable clamp with wire ties. Five on the inside of the frame section and Three on the top of the back horizontal frame section.
- Remove slack in harness by pulling harness to the front of the sprayer. Tighten wire ties and re-tighten hose guide bracket. Torque hose guide bracket flange nuts to recommended torque. (See Torque Table section)
- 10. Install SMV bracket (J) on the fixed center boom section, slightly left of center, by slipping the bracket between the Hose (K) and Square Tube (L) and secure using 5/16" x 1-3/4" Square U-Bolt (M) and two 5/16" Flange Nuts (N). Torque Flange Nuts to recommended torque. (See Torque Table section)




- 11. Connect 7 pin connector to the tractor's trailer plug and test operation of Tail, Stop, and Turn Signal Lights.
- 12. Disconnect 7 pin connector from tractor and hang connector on Spare Hook (S) located on front of sprayer.




(Optional) Install CAT 2 Pins


- Starting on left side, remove CAT 1 Pin (A) by removing 7/8" Nut and Lock Washer on backside of frame. Retain hardware and Linch Pin for installing CAT 2 Pin.
- 2. Remove four 1/2" x 1" Carriage Bolts (B).



- Loosely Install the CAT 2 Side Bracket (C) with the hole for the CAT 2 Pin closer to the front of the sprayer using four 1/2" x 1-1/2" Carriage Bolts (D) and 1/2" Flange Nuts (E).
- Loosely Install CAT 2 Brace (F) under the CAT 2 Side Bracket using two 1/2" x 1" Carriage Bolts (G) and 1/2" Flange Nuts (E).
- Install CAT 2 Side Pin (H) by inserting pin into the holes in both the CAT 2 Side Bracket and CAT 2 Brace using the Lock Washer (J) and 7/8" Nut (K) from step 1. Install Linch Pin from Step 1.



- 6. Torque hardware in the following order. (See Torque Table section)
 - a. CAT 2 Side Pin Nut (K)
 - b. CAT 2 Side Bracket Flange Nuts (E).
 - c. CAT 2 Brace Flange Nuts (E).
- 7. Repeat Steps 1-6 for right side.
- 8. Replace CAT 1 Top Link Pin (L) with CAT 2
 Top Link Pin (M) placing the CAT 2 Top Link
 Pin in the upper holes (N) of the Top Link
 Bracket and secure with Linch Pin from CAT
 1 Top Link Pin.

Sprayer Installation

Installing Ballast

CAUTION: Avoid Injury! Machine can become unstable when operating with an attachment. Ballast is required when the attachment is installed

· Do not use PTO adapters

Compact Utility Tractors

See Specification Section for implement code and refer to Ballasting Machine in your tractor operator's manual to determine the number of front weights required to ballast the tractor.

Mounting the Pump

- 1. Connect pump to tractor PTO shaft.
- Brace torque arm against solid member of tractor frame in the direction of PTO rotation.
 DO NOT brace against the 3-point lift arms or any other moving parts.
- 3. Connect chain fairly tight to tractor frame in opposite direction.

Note: We recommend using the drawbar (if possible) and wrapping the chain as shown below.



Attaching the Sprayer to Tractor

- Park machine safely. (See Park Machine Safely in Safety section)
- 2. Lower tractor lift link to lowest position.
- 3. Mount sprayer on 3-point hitch.

Attaching the Sprayer to Tractor with iMatch - Quick Hitch

- Connect iMatch Quick Hitch to tractor first following the iMatch – Quick Hitch installation instructions.
- Install bushing set (sold separately), John Deere Part Number BW15056 or equivalent, to lower draft pins and top link pin on sprayer.
- 3. Lower the tractor's 3-pt hitch aligning the center hook of the iMatch Quick Hitch just below the top link pin on the sprayer.
- 4. Ensure all three connection points are aligned.
- 5. Raise tractor's 3-pt hitch ensuring lower draft pins and top link are fully engaged with iMatch Quick Hitch.
- Close both levers on iMatch Quick Hitch to lock lower draft pins in place. Levers are closed when they are folded down (horizontal position).


Removing and Storing Sprayer

Removing Sprayer from Tractor



CAUTION: Avoid Injury! When the attachment is removed, also remove any ballast that was added to the machine.

- Park machine safely. (See Park Machine Safely in Safety section)
- 2. Lower sprayer to the ground.
- 3. Empty the sprayer tank. (See Operation section)
- 4. Disconnect sprayer from 3-point hitch.
- 5. Disconnect pump from PTO shaft.
- 6. Store pump by hanging on hook by the chain so that the pump and hoses do not contact the ground.




Store Sprayer Safely



CAUTION: Avoid Chemical Injury

- Wear protective clothes, gloves and goggles when handling sprayer.
- Do not store sprayer with chemicals in tank.
- If sprayer comes in contact with your body, immediately follow directions on chemical container pertaining to spray material.
- Open 3-way valve and drain excess fluid into chemical disposal container. (See Dispose of Waste Properly in Safety section)
- 2. Rinse tank, pump, spray wand and all hoses thoroughly with fresh clean water.
- 3. Repeat step 2 several times.
- 4. Allow tank to air dry.
- 5. Drain hoses and pump filter.
- 6. Check sprayer for worn or damaged parts. Replace parts as needed.
- 7. Tighten loose hardware.
- 8. Store sprayer in a place where it will not freeze.
- 9. Store pump by hanging on hook by the chain so that the pump and hoses do not contact the ground.

- Read chemical container label for mixing and handling instructions. A Safety Data Sheet (SDS) should be supplied by the chemical dealer and provides proper safety information.
- Wear proper clothing and safety equipment while handling or applying spray chemicals.
- Wear a full covering of clothing, protective goggles and rubber gloves.
- Prohibit all smoking, drinking, and eating around chemicals.
- When filling tank, never allow end of water hose to contact chemical mixture.

IMPORTANT: Avoid damage! Clean any spills immediately with clean water prior to operating sprayer.

- Park machine safely. (See Park Machine Safely in Safety section)
- 2. Lower tractor lift link so that the sprayer is firmly on the ground.
- 3. Clean area around tank filler cap to prevent tank contamination.
- 4. Remove tank filler cap and fill tank.
- 5. Install tank filler cap.


NOTE: The preferred location to fill the tank is from the front left corner.

Draining and Cleaning the Sprayer Tank



IMPORTANT: Avoid damage!

- Clean any spills. Proper disposal of excess spray is very important.
- Dilute it with water and apply it to area previously treated.
- Never dump excess into a storm drain or near a lake or stream.
- 1. To quickly empty the tank of excess material, turn 3-way valve (A) to drain position as shown.



- Spray all inside surfaces of tank with low pressure garden hose to remove any remaining solution. Rinse sprayer tank, pump, sprayer wand and all hoses thoroughly with fresh, clean water. Rinse several times to make sure sprayer tank is clean and free of chemicals.
- 3. When tank is empty, Allow tank to air dry.
- 4. Turn 3-way valve (A) to OFF position (Vertical) and install filler cap.

Calibrating the Sprayer

When spraying with boom, sprayer must be calibrated to ensure proper spray coverage and to combat over-application or under-application. The calibration process consists of three steps:

- Calculate speed of tractor.
- Determine nozzle size and consult calibration chart for desired or instructed gallon per acre (GPA).
- Set pressure using relief valve.

Calculating the Speed

It is important to determine what speed the tractor will be traveling while spraying. Even if tractor has a speedometer, it is still recommended that speed be checked for accuracy. Perform the following steps to determine speed:

- Measure a 200 or 300 foot distance on a field or surface similar to where sprayer will be used.
- 2. Drive tractor with half-full sprayer across measured distance at a constant and
- 3. comfortable speed for spraying. There can be no changes in speed while measuring time.
- 4. When using a gear-driven tractor, select a gear where PTO is at or near 540 rpm. This is important for pump to provide adequate pressure to sprayer when spraying.
- 5. Determine amount of time, in seconds, it takes to travel the measured distance.
- 6. Speed can be determined by entering data into the following equation:
- 7. speed (mph) = (distance (ft) x 60) / (time (sec) x 88) or by consulting the following table:

The spray nozzles on your sprayer are AIC11004, which match up with the calibration chart. Refer to the calibration chart. Using tractor speed, nozzle size, and desired gallons per acre (GPA), calculate pressure (psi) necessary

to achieve your GPA. It is important to note that lower pressure settings will result in less spray drift.

Example:

Assume tractor speed is determined to be 4 mph, nozzles are red (AIC11004) 30", and desired GPA is 20 GPA. The calibration charts shows that you should set sprayer's pressure at about 40 psi in order to apply 20 GPA.



Adjusting the Sprayer Pressure

NOTE: All calibration needs to be done with clean water.

Once correct pressure setting has been determined, the sprayer must be adjusted to that pressure setting. Before adjusting sprayer's pressure, it is important to set tractor rpm at rate that was used to determine tractor speed.

- Loosen lock ring (A) and adjust knob (B) to desired pressure. Pressure is displayed on gauge (C).
- 2. Once desired pressure is achieved tighten lock ring (A).
- 3. Sprayer is now calibrated.



Operating the Sprayer



- Do not pump flammable or explosive fluids such as gasoline, fuel oil, or kerosene.
- Do not pump acids (i.e., acid fertilizer)
 with super rollers. For acid fertilizer, Hypro
 recommends Silver Series cast with Teflon
 rollers (5CS43649 or 5CS43788).
- Do not run pump dry! Do not pump faster or above maximum recommended speed and pressure (1200 rpm, 300 psi).
- Do not pump liquids at temperatures higher than recommended maximum temperature (60°C, 140°F).
- Disengage PTO, release all pressure and drain all liquids before servicing pump.

Spraying with the Boom

 Calibrate the sprayer to achieve the desired gallons per acre (GPA). Refer to Calibrating the Sprayer and the Calibration Chart to determine the correct pressure settings.

- 2. Connect pump PTO coupler to PTO shaft.
- 3. Fill tank with water to set pressure and test for leaks.
- 4. Prepare to spray by turning section control valves to OFF and the 3-way valve (A) to the ON positon as shown.




- Start tractor and engage PTO. For adequate spraying pressure and tank agitation, PTO should be running at or near 540 rpm. Ensure pump is primed and there are no leaks in any lines.
- Use relief valve to adjust sprayer pressure to pressure rating determined during sprayer calibration. When opening control valve, it may be necessary to adjust pressure again.
- Ensure that tractor PTO is disengaged. Fill
 tank with amount of water and chemicals
 recommended by chemical being used. After
 filling tank, engage pump and allow ample
 amount of time for jet agitator to mix water
 and chemicals.

NOTE: Do not start sprayer operation until chemicals and water are mixed for the recommended time listed on the chemical instructions.

8. At spraying location, unfold the boom at locations away from hinges.


- Engage PTO, and make sure pressure setting is correct. While spraying, maintain a constant level of speed and rpm (rates determined when calibrated).
- 10. When complete, fold boom back into transport position. On 24 ft and 30 ft boom ensure the retaining strap is in place.



Boom Section Control

The Boom is divided into 3 sections of spray tips. Right, Center and Left. Each section can be turned ON and OFF individually using the boom section control valves.

- To turn a section ON move the corresponding handle to the horizontal position.
- 2. To turn a section OFF move the handle to the down position.
 - Right Section (A), Center Section(B), Left Section (C)



Spraying with the Spray Nozzle



CAUTION: Avoid Injury! DO NOT use spray nozzle while tractor is in motion.

- 1. Turn all Section Control valves to OFF.
- 2. Squeeze the handle (A) to spray.
- 3. Adjust mist to stream using lever (B).
- Spray guard (C) can be adjusted by loosening (D) and sliding spray guard to desired position. The spray guard is intended to keep over-spray off your hands.
- 5. Flip handle lock (E) forward to lock handle in ON position.

- Flush pump out with fresh water after every use.
- Winterize pump to prevent freezing and corrosion.
- Refer to Winterizing Sprayer for instructions.
- Change seals and rollers if pump is leaking or has a noticeable decrease in performance.

Winterizing Sprayer

It is important to winterize sprayer to avoid damage from freezing and corrosion before temperatures reach freezing levels.



CAUTION: Avoid injury! Do not use standard antifreeze. Standard antifreeze can be harmful to humans, animals, crops and the environment.

- 1. Empty and rinse tank.
- 2. Put one to two gallons of RV nontoxic antifreeze in tank.
- 3. Engage pump and spray with boom and

subsequently spray gun (if applicable). Ensure that antifreeze has been pumped through entire system, including all spray nozzles.

4. Store sprayer in a dry location away from elements.

Placing Sprayer Back in Service after Winterizing

- 1. Flush sprayer with fresh water to clean out all antifreeze and any other buildup.
- 2. Do a thorough inspection of all components before spraying.

Cleaning Spray Tips



CAUTION: Avoid injury!


- Wear protective clothes, gloves and goggles when handling sprayer.
- Do not put the nozzle tips or other parts to your lips to blow out dirt.
- If spray comes in contact with your body, immediately follow directions on chemical container pertaining to spray material.
- 1. Remove spray nozzle (A) from sprayer.
- 2. Remove the spray tip (B) and gasket (C) from the spray nozzle (A).
- 3. Remove the screen (D) from the nozzle socket on the boom. Replace the screen if damaged.

IMPORTANT: Avoid damage! Do not use a wire to clean the opening (E) in the spray tip.

- 4. Wash the screen (D) and spray tip (B) in a nonflammable solvent.
- 5. Align the flat side (F) of the spray tip with the flat on the opening of the spray nozzle (A), and install the spray tip into the nozzle.


NOTE: Verify that the opening (E) in the spray tip is pointing down when the nozzle assembly is installed on the nozzle socket.

- 6. Install the screen (D) into the nozzle socket on the boom.
- 7. Install nozzle assembly on the nozzle socket.



NOTE: Due to normal wear, Teejet® recommends replacing sprayer nozzles after every spraying season. Nozzle replacement will ensure accurate spraying performance.


Cleaning and Replacing Filter

- 3. Unscrew filter Housing (B) and remove filter.
- 4. To clean filter flush with clean water and reinstall filter. Ensure filter housing is tight.
- Turn 3-way valve (A) to ON Position (towards filter) and check for leaks around filter housing.
